AN ACT

Relating to certain plant thefts, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

- Section 1. 1. A person commits the offense of wild
2 plant theft if he digs, cuts or takes any wild plant or
3 plant part from public property, without permission of
4 the agency or governmental entity responsible for the
5 administration of that public property.
6 2. For purposes of this section, "wild plant" includes
7 any tree, shrub, vine, wildflower, grass or fern, but shall
8 not include seeds, fruits, nuts or berries of wild plants.
9 3. Wild plant theft is a class B misdemeanor.

AN ACT

Relating to certain noxious weeds, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

- Section 1. The plant purple loosestrife (*Lythrum*
2 *salicaria*), and any hybrids thereof, is hereby designated
3 a noxious weed. No person shall buy, sell, offer for sale,
4 distribute or plant seeds, plants or parts of plants of
5 purple loosestrife without a permit issued by the Missouri
6 department of conservation. Such permits shall be issued
7 only for experiments to control and eliminate nuisance
8 weeds. Any person who violates the provisions of this
9 section shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

PLANT LEGISLATION INTRODUCED

House Bills No. 924 and No. 869 have been introduced into the 85th General Assembly. HB 869 prohibits the sale of purple loosestrife in Missouri. HB 924 protects wild plants on public lands. Representative Sam Leake from Ralls County introduced the loosestrife bill (#869). The wild plant theft bill is sponsored by Representative Ted House of St. Charles County. Copies of these bills are printed below.

Your help is needed if these bills are to pass, particularly HB 924. Here's how you can help.

1. Write or call your State Representative in support of these bills.
2. Write or call members of the House Agriculture Committee in support of HB 869 (HB 924 has not yet been assigned to a committee). House Ag Committee members are listed below.

Communicating with Legislators - Try the following when you want to gain the attention of a legislator.

1. Identify the piece of legislation by bill number.
2. State the reason for writing (calling) and how it will affect you, your organization, your community, the state, etc.
3. Write to legislators belonging to both parties, not just yours.
4. After telling the legislator your position, ask for a response.
5. Make it short and to the point.
6. Include your name and address.
7. Your letter (call) will be counted and is important - if a legislator receives just a few pieces of correspondence on a specific item, his/her attention will be gained.

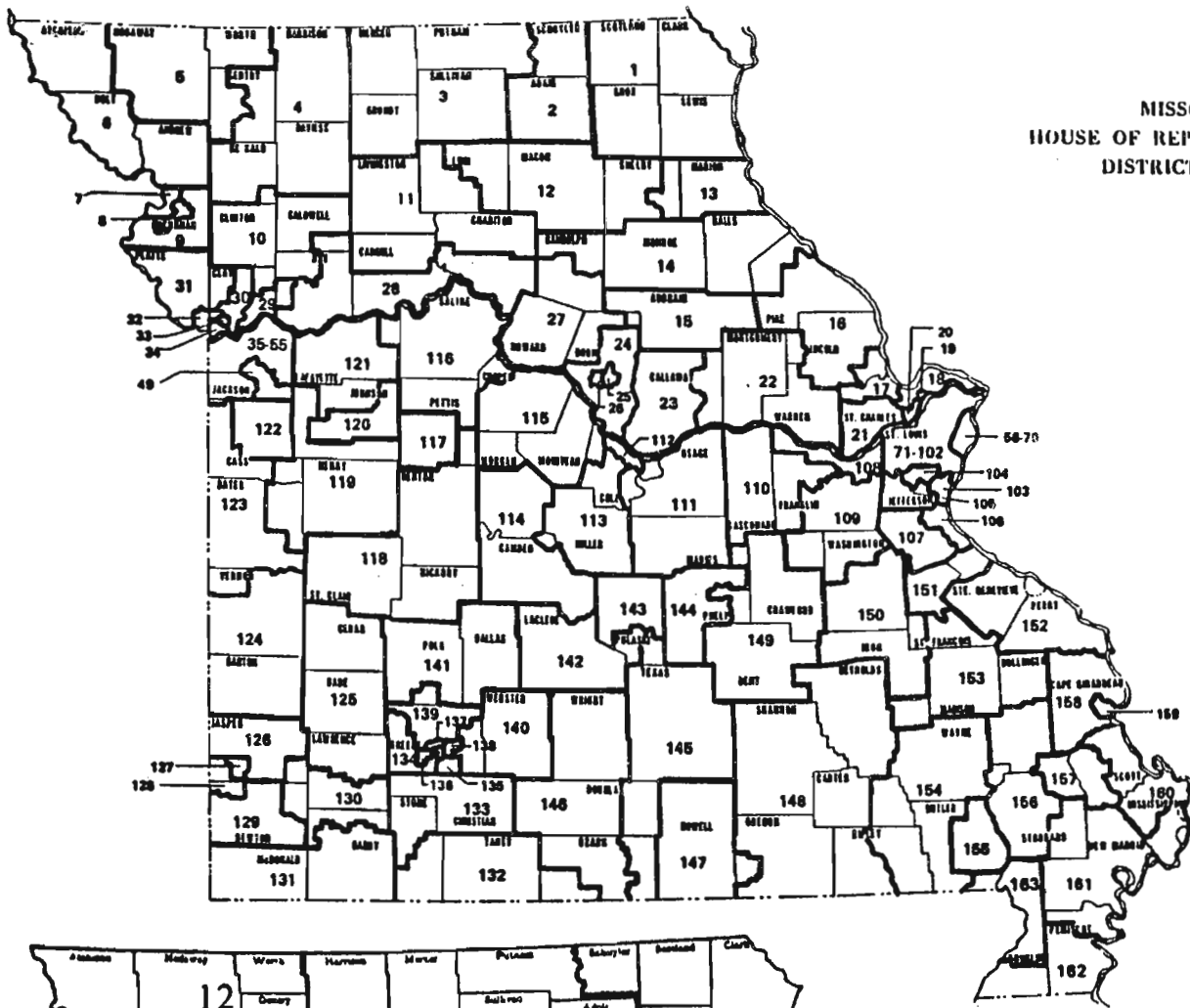

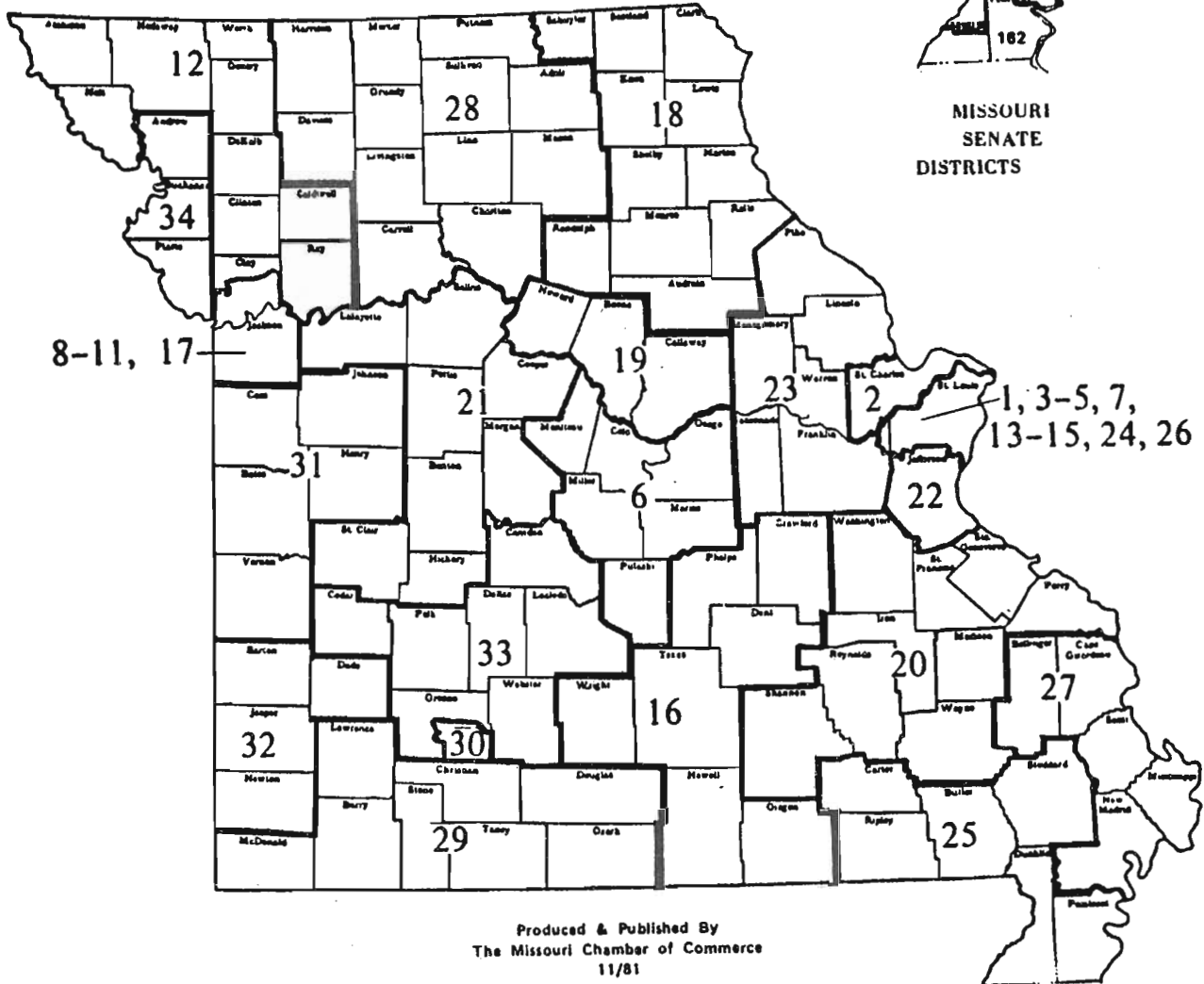
